Feedback on Habitat for Humanity Excel Training Sessions, May 2010: As reported in our last newsletter, on May 25, 2010, Karen Sieczka and Julie Sanders conducted a training event for Atlanta Habitat for Humanity. Karen designed and facilitated a two-part Excel 2007 training session, and Julie coordinated the use of a computer lab for the class at Emory University's Center for Lifelong Learning.

Later this summer, as a follow-up to the Excel class, Chris Martin, Senior Resources Manager for Atlanta Habitat for Humanity, provided the following feedback: "Evaluations for the class were excellent, and attendees were very appreciative for the new information. Karen was very well received."

Habitat for Humanity Skills Assessment Project, 2010: On July 22, 2010, Karen Sieczka compiled and presented the final results of a technical skills assessment survey for Atlanta Habitat for Humanity. Karen, along with Julie Sanders and Barbara Smith, began the project in January, going through Habitat's job descriptions and grouping together the major skills sets.

The technical skills were chosen to pilot the project, in order to assess the staff's level of expertise in Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, and Access. All 46 Atlanta Habitat staffers answered the questionnaire, which Karen created in Survey Monkey.

The assessment will be used to pinpoint technical topic areas where ASTD can provide training for Habitat in the upcoming year, and will be used for planning for 2011.

In August, Chris Martin, Senior Resources Manager for Atlanta Habitat for Humanity, provided the following feedback regarding the survey:

"I am working with the technology survey results – Karen set up an amazing spreadsheet that lets me view the data many different ways. It is pretty apparent that our staff is very much in need of training in Word and Outlook."

Karen and Julie will meet with Chris Martin the week of August 23, 2010 to discuss future training needs for the rest of this year, which were highlighted by the survey results. Atlanta Habitat for Humanity is also considering the roll-out of a similar soft-skills survey in the near future.
