Recycling: How to Promote Your Events with Social Media

I love recycling. No, not the aluminum can kind of recycling (although, that's good too). I'm talking about recycling information. When I can take a piece of information and put it to good use through more than one avenue, I feel like I just scored a major bargain (another thing I love to do). Queue social media, stage right...

Events, whether a large conference or small monthly meetings, can be publicized by simply sharing the details through social media channels. No longer do we have to write a press release, send it to a few places, and hope for exposure. Now, after we have written that release, we can recycle those particulars to create exposure.

Five easy ways to recycle:

1. Transcribe the information into multiple posts appropriate for the social media sites you use, such Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn. All sites are different, so consider etiquette **[character** hyperlinks, count.



- acronym usage, etc.] when you write.
- 2. If you're using Twitter, make use of a "hashtag" that will be included in all tweets before, during and after the event. This makes the details searchable. If your event is ongoing, this is another way to tie the information together. More info on hashtags here.
- 3. Utilize URL shorten services, such as bit.ly. (FYI: http://bit.ly/hashtag_dlg is the shortened URL that points to the site mentioned above) so that your character count isn't eaten up by the long web address to the event registration details. [24 characters versus the original 67, in my example.]
- 4. Find out if your speakers/presenters are on Twitter, Facebook, and LinkedIn and connect with them. Notify them of the activity you are creating online so they can repurpose the information too by retweeting/sharing/linking to their network.
- 5. Utilize your planning committee to leverage the content as well. Find a champion or 2 (or more) and include them in your plan to use social media. Provide them with the prewritten material and all they need to do is copy/paste/post.

One definition says, "Recycling involves taking something useful and turning it into something new instead of throwing it away." I am all for that! For your next event I encourage you to do your part and "recycle" to make that event a big success.--contributed by Dawn Gartin
